Larval Food: Stored animal and vegetable products. Fungi out of doors. Map SP 92.

Tinea columbariella Wocke (239)

One in the RIS trap at Cockayne Hatley in July 1999

Flight: July (week 27)* to October

Larval Food: Refuse of animal origin; in birds' nests, poultry houses, on owl pellets, etc.

Caloptilia populetorum (Zeller) (281)

In the RIS trap at Cockayne Hatley, October 1991.

Flight: August to May.

Larval Foodplants: Birches. Map TL 24

Phyllonorycter platani (Staudinger) (321a)

Several mines in fallen leaves at The Embankment, Bedford in November 1998. At Carlton and

Ashburnham Road, Bedford, in November 2001.

Flight: not confirmed in Britain.

Larval Foodplant: London plane *. Map SP95, TL 04, 05

Argyresthia glaucinella Zeller (416)

Signs of larval feeding at Studham, Sharnbrook, Great Hayes Wood, late April, 1998

and other sites since then. **Flight**: July, August.

Larval Foodplants: Oaks*, in the bark. Map SP 92,93,95,96 TL 01,02,14

Coleophora conyzae Zeller (521)

One in the RIS trap at Cockayne Hatley in July 1996.

Flight: July (week 27)*

Larval Foodplants: Ploughman's spikenard and common fleabane. Map TL 03.

Coleophora trochilella (Duponchel) (556)

One in the RIS trap at Cockayne Hatley in July 1999, and one at Biggleswade,

26 July 2002.

Flight: July (weeks 28, 30)*, August

Larval Foodplants: Mugwort, wormwood, yarrow, tansy and ox-eye daisy. Map TL 14, 24

Coleophora asteris Muhlig (562)

One specimen of this coastal species to mv light at Sharnbrook on 20 August 1997.

Flight: July, August (week 34)*

Larval Foodplant: Sea aster. Map SP 95.

Elachista alpinella Stainton (599)

One to my light at Sharnbrook on 18 July 1997 and one in the RIS trap at

Telechrysis tripuncta (Haworth) (646)

One found indoors at Studham by C.R. Baker on 28 June 2001.

Pseudatemelia josephinae (Toll) (660)

One found indoors at Studham by C.R.Baker on 24 July 1998

Flight: June to August (week 30)*

Larval Food: Probably leaf-litter and lichens. Map TL 01

Paltodora cytisella (Curtis) (728)

Cooper's Hill, Ampthill. One moth, caught 26 July 1992, identified in 1998.

Flight: July (week 30)*

Larval Foodplant: Bracken. Map TL 03

Apodia bifractella (Duponchel) (730)

Two moths in the RIS trap at Cockayne Hatley, week 13-19 August 1997. Also in 1998 and 1999.

Flight: July, August (weeks 31, 32)*

Larval Foodplants: Common fleabane, Inula spp. and sea-aster. Map TL 24

Monochroa conspersella (Herrich-Schaffer) (739)

Mis-identified. This entry should be deleted and replaced by:

Post VCH: Recorded from the RIS traps at Cockayne Hatley (week 9-15 July 1995), and Eaton Bray

(week 2-8 July 1997)

Flight: June to August (weeks 27, 28)*

Larval Foodplant: Dropwort Map SP 92, TL 24

Monochroa hornigi (Staudinger) (740)

Several specimens in the RIS trap at Cockayne Hatley in 1996.

Flight: June to August (weeks 26-29, 33)*

Larval Foodplants: Polygonum spp. Map TL 24.

Bryotropha similis (Stainton) (780)

One in the RIS trap at Cockayne Hatley in July 1989. (Genitalia slide determined May 2002)

Flight: June to August

Larval Foodplants: Mosses on walls. Map TL 24.

Aroga velocella (Zeller) (796)

One moth swept from heather at Cooper's Hill on 11 July 1997.

Flight: May, July and August (week 28)*
Larval Foodplant: Sheep's sorrel. Map TL 03.

Gelechia senticetella Staudinger (801a)

Two in the RIS trap at Eaton Bray in 1997. This moth from Southern Europe was first found in Britain in 1988 and is now recorded in a few southern counties.

Reuttia subocellea (Stephens) (840)

Larva in case made of thyme seed-pods at Knocking Hoe on 5 September 1999 (R.W.Uffen)

Larval Foodplants: Marjoram, water-mint, thyme. Map TL 13

Syncopacma larseniella (Gozmány) (844)

Several netted at Double Arches Quarry (Heath and Reach) on

22 June 2001 (C.R. Baker). **Flight:** June, July (week 25)*

Larval Foodplant: Greater bird's-foot trefoil. Map SP 92

Syncopacma taeniolella (Zeller) (847)

One netted on chalk grassland at Studham on 23 July 1997.

Flight: July (week 30)*

Larval Foodplants: Bird's-foot trefoil, clovers and medicks. Map TL 01.

Anacampsis blattariella (Hubner) (854)

One to MV light at Potton, 27 July 2002 (J. Childs)

Flight: July, August (week 30)*

Larval Food: Leaf litter. Map TL24

Mompha bradleyi Reidl (889a)

One found indoors at Rifle Range Farm, Yelden, on 19 February 2002 (A. Paynter)

Further specimens at the same site, 26 and 28 September 2002

Flight: July to September, and after hibernation until May (weeks 8, 39)*

Larval Foodplant: Great willowherb. Map TL 06

Blastodacna atra (Haworth) (906)

One moth in the RIS trap at Cockayne Hatley in August 1998.

Flight: July, August (week 32)*

Larval Foodplant: Apple, in a shoot. Map TL 24

Sorhagenia lophyrella (Douglas) (909)

One moth in the RIS trap at Cockayne Hatley in August 1995.

(identified from ♀ genitalia slide in 2002. Previously misidentified as S. rhamniella)

Flight: May to August (week 31)*

Larval Foodplant: Buckthorn. Map TL 24

Cnephasia genitalana Pierce & Metcalfe (1023)

Stotfold, 5 August 1988 (T. Hollingworth). Sharnbrook, 21 July 2000.

One in the RIS trap at Cockayne Hatley in 1996, and one in 1997.

Flight: July, August (week 32)*

Larval Foodplants: Polyphagous on herbaceous plants. Map SP 95, TL 06,23,24.

Endothenia ustulana (Haworth) (1101)

One to MV light at Sharnbrook, 11 July 1998

Flight: June, July (week 28)*

Larval Foodplant: Bugle. Map SP 95

Endothenia ericetana (Humphreys & Westwood) (1103)

RIS trap at Cockayne Hatley in 1996, and Forty Acre Wood, 23 June 1998.

Flight: June to September (weeks 25, 36)*

Larval Foodplants: Marsh woundwort, corn mint. Map SP 95, TL 24

Bactra furfurana (Haworth) (1110)

One in the RIS trap at Cockayne Hatley in 2000.

Flight: June to August (week 32)*

Larval Foodplants: Common club-rush, compact rush. Map TL24

Crocidosema plebejana Zeller (1157)

One to MV light at Luton, 5 August 1999 (R. Wilson) **Flight**: June to August (week 31)*, September, October

Larval Foodplant: Spindle. Map TL 02

Homoeosoma nebulella ([Denis & Schiffermüller]) (1480)

One to MV light at Ampthill Park, 21 September 2001. **Flight:** June to August, occasionally September (week 38)*

Larval Foodplants: Spear-thistle, common ragwort, tansy, ox-eye daisy. Map TL 03

Phycitodes maritima (Tengstrom) (1485)

One to MV light at Sharnbrook, 2 August 1999.

Flight: May; July, August (week 31)*

Larval Foodplants: Yarrow, common ragwort, tansy. Map SP 95

Ovendenia lienigianus (Zeller) (1513)

Two specimens to malaise trap at Luton Airport, between 15 June and 5 July 1999 (C.W. Plant).

One in the RIS trap at Cockayne Hatley between 25 June and 1 July 1999.
